Dear Mellisa and the Carroll County Delegation:

I would like to express my interest in filling the vacancy created by the on again, off again, on again resignation of Commissioner Plache. While I believe most of you know me, I attach my resume for your consideration.

The largest issue facing Carroll County at the moment is the rapid deterioration of the financials at Mountainview. Referring to the first quarter 2023 financial statement, https://www.carrollcountynh.net/.../financials_-_1q_2023.pdf, I am certain the delegation noted the following issues:

On page 15: Mountainview's revenue for the quarter was \$2.9M. This extrapolates to \$11.6M for the year -- \$600K below budget. Last year it exceeded budget by \$1.7M.

On page 16: Agency fees were \$222K for quarter, which extrapolates to \$888K for the year. Historically this line was \$15K per year. In 2022 it was \$97K.

Comparing 2022 to this year, combining these items, Mountainview will require \$3.2M more support from taxpayers. The most recent annual report available on the county website for 2020 shows \$16.5M raised per year in property taxes. Failing to address this issue and making up this deficit with property taxes would require a 19.4% increase in county property taxes.

This is clearly an issue which transcends party lines and will affect all residents and taxpayers in Carroll County.

I believe I am uniquely qualified to assist the county in addressing this issue both due to my experience turning Huggins Hospital finances around during my two five year terms as Treasurer, and due to my experience with the county budget during my time on the county delegation.

I am a resident and registered voter in Brookfield, which is one of the towns in District 3.

Dear Mellisa and the Carroll County Delegation:

I have just had the opportunity to review Carroll County's July financial statement, and would like to update my July 28 letter of interest in the vacant Commissioner's position with the following:

The June financial statement shows the County Commissioners still have time to address the rapid deterioration of quality of care at Mountainview before it seriously impacts the county financials. This is a substantial improvement over the first quarter financials.

On p.11 MVC revenue for 7 months is \$10,044,218. Excluding Proshare (which is a lump sum item) its \$6,881,186. Annualizing that and adding back Proshare gives \$14,959,351. This would be \$2,676,763 over budget for the year.

On p.13 MVC expenses for 7 months is \$9,910,910. Excluding Long Term debt (lump sum item) its \$8,930,910. Annualizing that and adding back long term debt payment is \$16,290,131. This would be \$836,180 under budget for the year.

On p.12 Agency fees are \$755,382 for 7 months which annualizes to \$1,294,941. Obviously this remains way more than the \$15,000 Howie budgeted.

The bottom line is MVC remains overbudget for revenue and underbudget for expenses to the tune of \$3,512,943 which gives considerable slack to address the quality of care issues, hopefully before revenue from our private pay patients drops off. This needs to be a priority for the Commissioners going forward. Private pay room and board 300.3404.012 on p.11 is \$2,953,984 which annualizes to \$5,063,973 or \$1,371,085 over budget -- 2/3 of the revenue surplus. It is unreasonable to expect this to continue if the quality of care issues are not immediately addressed.

I am very happy for the residents and staff of Mountainview that we have the resources to deal with these issues, and I am happy for the taxpayers that the 7 month financials appear considerably better than the 1st quarter.
