Since last Commissioner's report,
MVC bus has been delivered and lettered.

MVC Housekeeping and Maintenance Departments are at full staff.

With Bob's assistance, outdoor cleanup of MVC is underway. Shout out to Supt. Eldridge for arranging inmates to assist with cleanup, and DPW Director Dewitt for lending tools and equipment.

Administration Building 2nd floor window has been replaced.

MVC/DOC internal fiber optic upgrade has started. Lines are run to their termination points. We are waiting for end switches to be installed, finalizing connection.

Upgrade to MVC security camera system and additional card swipe door locks to be installed soon. Hopefully end of June.

Another administration office reconfiguration and associated IT work took place recently, moving Mellisa downstairs doubling up with Laura, and the Attorney's office moving into what was Mellisa's office.

Jail sallyport door RFP failed to produce bidders. However, of the companies that were direct solicited in the original RFP, one has returned a proposal, one has flatly said that they are too busy, and others have failed to respond.

HVAC Service agreement with ENE of NH has been officiated by the Commissioners and myself. Awaiting parts ordered and project to commence.

One MVC dryer was inop for two weeks while awaiting parts. It has since been repaired.

All 7 County generators have had their spring service.

Nurse station carpet tile replacement has started, awaiting completion of last one.

Maureen Callahan from USource reached out to me to let me know that it "appears" that the 1mw municipal cap law change to 5mw will happen in June. She wanted to know if the Commissioners desired further discussion.

Propane tank gas valve repair has been completed.
